Academic OneFile (formerly *InfoTrac OneFile*) 1980+

Provides citations, abstracts, and some full text articles from journals with good coverage of the social sciences and a wide variety of health and medical topics.

Academic Search Premier

A full-text, multidisciplinary magazine & journal database that provides the full text of over 4,500 journals and magazines, and indexes a total of more than 8,000 titles in all disciplines.

AGELINE 1978+

Summarizes articles in social gerontology (the study of aging in psychological, health-related, social, and economic contexts).

Current Awareness Service

Many of the libraries' licensed research databases and electronic journal collections offer users the ability to create research alert profiles — automated keyword and tables of content searches — sent weekly to an email address.

LexisNexis News

Full text for most materials, including newspapers, magazines, news wires, transcripts, and legal resources.

Good coverage of international news, but includes only a few academic research journals.

PsycINFO 1887+

References to and summaries of the key journal articles in the international psychology and behavioral science literature and the related fields of education, business, medicine, and law. Starting with 1987, also includes books and book chapters.

PubMed–MEDLINE through *National Library of Medicine* 1966+

Medline is the National Library of Medicine's (NLM) premier database of journal citations and abstracts covering nearly 4,500 journals published in the U.S. and more than 70 other countries. In addition to providing access to MEDLINE, PubMed provides access to out-of-scope citations from certain MEDLINE journals, primarily general science and chemistry journals for which the life sciences articles are indexed for MEDLINE; citations that precede the date that a journal was selected for MEDLINE indexing; and some additional life science journals that submit full text to PubMedCentral™ and receive a qualitative review by NLM.

SCOPUS 1966+

SCOPUS is the world's largest journal indexing and abstracting database with 27 million records covering articles from 14,000 peer-reviewed titles from more than 4,000 international publishers. It is the most comprehensive scientific, medical, technical and social science point of access containing all relevant literature.

Sociological Abstracts 1963+

International in scope, many foreign language journals are included.

Web of Science 1994+

Offers citation searching for the sciences, social sciences, and humanities (including *Social Sciences Citation Index* and *Arts & Humanities Citation Index*) on authors, co-authors, and keyword searching of abstracts and titles.
